## Multiple Independent Observations

- If two events are mutually independent the joint probability of two events can be written as

$$
\begin{aligned}
\operatorname{Pr}\left(A_{i 1} \& A_{i 2} \mid B_{j}\right) & =\operatorname{Pr}\left(A_{i 1}, A_{i 2} \mid B_{j}\right) \\
& =\operatorname{Pr}\left(A_{i 1} \mid B_{j}\right) \times \operatorname{Pr}\left(A_{i 2} \mid B_{j}\right)
\end{aligned}
$$

Posterior Probability

$$
\operatorname{Pr}\left(B_{j} \mid A_{i 1}, A_{i 2}\right)=\frac{1}{\sum_{j=1}^{b} \operatorname{Pr}\left(A_{i 1}, A_{i 2}, B_{j}\right)} \operatorname{Pr}\left(A_{i 1}, A_{i 2}, B_{j}\right)
$$

## Multiple Independent Observations

Note that the posterior odds of not Fair to Fair, given Head, is larger with this example.
$\frac{\operatorname{Pr}(\text { not } F \text { air } \mid \text { Head })}{\operatorname{Pr}(\text { Fair } \mid \text { Head })}=\frac{.571}{.429}=1.333<1.778=\frac{.640}{.360}=\frac{\operatorname{Pr}(\text { not } \text { Fair } \mid \text { Head, Head })}{\operatorname{Pr}(\text { Fair } \mid \text { Head }, \text { Head })}$
Multiple observations provide more information on B.

Note also that, $\operatorname{Pr}($ Fair $\mid$ Head, Tail $)=\operatorname{Pr}($ Fair $\mid$ Tail, Head $)$.
Nunber of Heads is sufficient for the inference.

## Two Test Scores

Note that, with this example (CPT) the sum of two test scores is not sufficient. For example the posterior probability of B given sum $=6$ are shown below.

If CPT is proportional to the PDF of the Normal distribution, sum is the sufficient statistics.

$$

Posterior Probability

$$
\operatorname{Pr}\left(B_{j} \mid A_{i 1}, A_{i 2}, \ldots, A_{i n}\right)=\frac{\operatorname{Pr}\left(A_{i 1}, A_{i 2}, \ldots, A_{i n} \mid B_{j}\right) \operatorname{Pr}\left(B_{j}\right)}{\sum_{j=1}^{b} \operatorname{Pr}\left(A_{i 1}, A_{i 2}, \ldots, A_{i n} \mid B_{j}\right) \operatorname{Pr}\left(B_{j}\right)}
$$

$\propto\left(\prod_{k=1}^{n} \operatorname{Pr}\left(A_{i k} \mid B_{j}\right)\right) \operatorname{Pr}\left(B_{j}\right)$

## Numerical Category Values

- When the categories have numerical value, CPT can be expressed by a formula $f(. \mid$.$) .$

Let $A$ and $B$ be the random varialbes whose values are $\alpha_{i}$ and $\beta_{j}$.

\operatorname{Pr}\left(B_{j} \mid A_{i 1}, A_{i 2}, \ldots, A_{i n}\right)=\frac{\left(\prod_{k=1}^{n} \operatorname{Pr}\left(A_{i k} \mid B_{j}\right)\right) \operatorname{Pr}\left(B_{j}\right)}{\sum_{j=1}^{b}\left(\left(\prod_{k=1}^{n} \operatorname{Pr}\left(A_{i k} \mid B_{j}\right)\right) \operatorname{Pr}\left(B_{j}\right)\right)}
$$

$$
\operatorname{Pr}\left(A_{i} \mid B_{j}\right)=\operatorname{Pr}\left(A=\alpha_{i} \mid B=\beta_{j}\right)=f\left(\alpha_{i} \mid \beta_{j}\right)
$$

## Coin Toss: Bernoulli Distribution

A: Indicator Variable

1 & \text { Head } \\
0 & \text { Tail }
\end{array}\right.\right.
$$

B: Success Probability

$$
\begin{aligned}
& 0 \leq \beta_{j} \leq 1 \\
& \quad \operatorname{Pr}\left(A=1 \mid B=\beta_{j}\right)=\beta_{j} \quad \& \quad \operatorname{Pr}\left(A=0 \mid B=\beta_{j}\right)=1-\beta_{j}
\end{aligned}
$$

CPT: Bernoulli Distribution

$$
\operatorname{Pr}\left(A=\alpha \mid B=\beta_{j}\right)=f\left(\alpha \mid \beta_{i}\right)=\beta_{j}^{\alpha}\left(1-\beta_{j}\right)^{1-\alpha}
$$

## Coin Toss: Binomial Distribution

Let $Y$ be the random number representing the number of Heads out or $N$ tosses. There are $\binom{N}{y}$ sequences of $A_{(k)}, k=1,2, \ldots, N$, which result in $y$ Heads, i.e.

$$
\sum_{k=1}^{N} \alpha_{(k)}=y
$$

CPT: Binomial Distribution

$$
\begin{aligned}
\operatorname{Pr}\left(Y=y \mid B_{j}=\beta_{j}\right)= & \text { number of combinations } \times \\
& \operatorname{Pr}\left(\sum_{k=1}^{N} \alpha_{(k)}=y \mid B_{j}=\beta_{j}\right) \\
= & f\left(y \mid \beta_{j}\right) \\
= & \binom{N}{y} \times \beta_{j}^{y}\left(1-\beta_{j}\right)^{N-y}
\end{aligned}
$$

## Coin Toss: Binomial Distribution

Two observations: $A_{(1)}$ and $A_{(2)}$

& =\binom{N}{y} \times \beta_{j}^{y}\left(1-\beta_{j}\right)^{N-y} \operatorname{Pr}\left(B=\beta_{j}\right)
\end{aligned}
$$

Posterior Probability

$$
\begin{aligned}
& \operatorname{Pr}\left(B=\beta_{j} \mid Y=y\right) \propto \operatorname{Pr}\left(Y=y, B=\beta_{j}\right) \propto \beta_{j}^{y}\left(1-\beta_{j}\right)^{N-y} \operatorname{Pr}\left(B=\beta_{j}\right) \\
& \begin{aligned}
\operatorname{Pr}\left(B=\beta_{j} \mid Y=y\right) & =\frac{\operatorname{Pr}\left(Y=y, B=\beta_{j}\right)}{\sum_{j=1}^{b} \operatorname{Pr}\left(Y=y, B=\beta_{j}\right)} \\
& =\frac{\beta_{j}^{y}\left(1-\beta_{j}\right)^{N-y} \operatorname{Pr}\left(B=\beta_{j}\right)}{\sum_{j=1}^{b} \beta_{j}^{y}\left(1-\beta_{j}\right)^{N-y} \operatorname{Pr}\left(B=\beta_{j}\right)}
\end{aligned}
\end{aligned}

## Discrete Random Variables

- probability function

$$
\begin{gathered}
f(x)=\operatorname{Pr}(X=x) \quad x_{0} \leq X \leq x_{1} \\
\sum_{x=x_{0}}^{x_{1}} f(x)=1
\end{gathered}
$$

- distribution function

$$
\begin{aligned}
& \operatorname{Pr}(X \leq x)=F(x)=\sum_{z=x_{0}}^{x} f(z) \\
& \operatorname{Pr}(a<X \leq b)=\sum_{x=x_{0}}^{b} f(x)-\sum_{x=x_{0}}^{a} f(x)=F(b)-F(a)
\end{aligned}
$$

## Continuous Random Variables

- probability distribution function and density (pdf)

$$
\operatorname{Pr}(X \leq x)=F(x)=\int_{-\infty}^{x} f(z) d z \quad \int_{X} f(x) d x=1
$$

- probabilities

$$
\begin{aligned}
& \operatorname{Pr}(a \leq X \leq b)=\int_{a}^{b} f(x) d x \\
& \operatorname{Pr}(X=x)=0
\end{aligned}
$$

$$
\operatorname{Pr}(x-\varepsilon<X \leq x+\varepsilon) \propto f(x)
$$

$$
F^{-1}(\alpha)=\min x \in R: p \leq F(x)
$$

## Joint PDF, Conditional PDF

- joint pdf
$\int_{Y} \int_{X} f(x, y) d x d y=1$
- conditional pdf

$$
\begin{array}{ll}
f(x \mid y)=\frac{f(x, y)}{f(y)} & f(y \mid x)=\frac{f(x, y)}{f(x)} \\
\int_{X} f(x \mid y) d x=1, & \int_{Y} f(y \mid x) d y=1
\end{array}
$$

## Bayes Theorem (continuous)

- Bayes theorem

$$
h(\theta \mid y)=\frac{f(\theta, y)}{f(y)}=\frac{f(y \mid \theta) h(\theta)}{\int_{\Theta} f(y \mid \theta) h(\theta) d \theta}
$$

- proportionality

$$
\begin{aligned}
h(\theta \mid y) & =\frac{1}{\int_{\Theta} f(y \mid \theta) h(\theta) d \theta} f(y \mid \theta) h(\theta) \\
& \propto f(y \mid \theta) h(\theta)
\end{aligned}
$$

- Posterior pdf is proportional to

Likelihood x Prior pdf

## Bayesian Inference

- Specify the model distribution (likelihood.)
$f(y \mid \theta) \quad \theta$ is called the parameter of the model.
- Express your prior belief on the model parameter as the prior distribution. (prior pdf)

$$
h(\theta)
$$

- Update your prior belief on the model parameter by combining the prior pdf and the likelihood.

$$
\begin{aligned}
h(\theta \mid y) & =\frac{1}{\int_{\Theta} f(y \mid \theta) h(\theta) d \theta} f(y \mid \theta) h(\theta) \\
& \propto f(y \mid \theta) h(\theta)
\end{aligned}
$$

## Non-informative Prior

- If we do not have any knowledge on $\theta$

$$
h(\theta)=1
$$

- Posterior distribution of $\theta$

$$
\begin{aligned}
& \begin{aligned}
& h(\theta \mid y) \propto f(y \mid \theta) h(\theta)=f(y \mid \theta) \\
&=\theta^{y}(1-\theta)^{N-y} \\
& \int_{0}^{1} \theta^{y}(1-\theta)^{N-y} d \theta=B(y+1, N-y+\mathbf{1})
\end{aligned} \\
& h(\theta \mid y)=\frac{1}{B(y+1, N-y+1)} \theta^{y}(1-\theta)^{N-y} \\
& \text { pdf of Beta distribution } \\
& B(a, b)=\frac{\Gamma(a) \Gamma(b)}{\Gamma(a+b)}
\end{aligned}
$$

Based on the \# of successes out of $N$ trials, we must make inference on the parameter q which is the probability of success.

$$
\begin{array}{r}
\beta_{j}, j=1,2, \ldots, b, \quad b \rightarrow+\infty \\
\beta_{j} \equiv \theta
\end{array}
$$

- How do we specify the prior distribution?


## Beta Distribution

- pdf: $\quad X$ ~ Beta $(\alpha, \beta)$

$$
\begin{aligned}
f(x \mid \alpha, \beta) & =\frac{1}{B(\alpha, \beta)} \times x^{\alpha-1}(1-x)^{\beta-1} \\
B(\alpha, \beta) & =\frac{\Gamma(\alpha) \Gamma(\beta)}{\Gamma(\alpha+\beta)}
\end{aligned}
$$

- moments

$$
\begin{array}{r}
\mathcal{E}(X)=\frac{\alpha}{\alpha+\beta}, \quad \operatorname{var}(X)=\frac{\alpha \beta}{(\alpha+\beta)^{2}(\alpha+\beta+1)} \\
\operatorname{mode}(X)=\frac{\alpha-1}{\alpha+\beta-2}(\alpha>1 \& \beta>1)
\end{array}
$$

## Beta Distribution

$a=4, b=6$

$a=6, b=4$


## Identifying Posterior Distribution

If we know

$$
h(\theta \mid y) \propto \theta^{y+\alpha_{0}-1}(1-\theta)^{N-y+\beta_{0}-1}
$$

the we know

$$
\theta \mid \sim \operatorname{Beta}\left(y+\alpha_{0}, N-y+\beta_{0}\right)
$$

## How to Choose Point Estimate

- Expected loss

Choose d which minimizes:

- Various types of expected loss

$$
\begin{aligned}
\text { Squared Error Loss } & =(d-\theta)^{2} \\
\text { Bilinear Error Loss } & = \begin{cases}a(d-\theta) & \text { if } d \leq \theta \\
b(\theta-d) & \text { if } d>\theta\end{cases} \\
0-1 \text { Error Loss } & = \begin{cases}0 & \text { if }|d-\theta| \leq b \\
1 & \text { if }|d-\theta|>b\end{cases}
\end{aligned}
$$

$$
\mathcal{E} L(d \mid \boldsymbol{y})=\mathcal{E}_{\Theta}(L(d, \theta) \mid \boldsymbol{y})=\int_{\Theta} L(d, \theta) h(\theta \mid \boldsymbol{y}) d \theta
$$

mean
median

$$
\begin{aligned}
\mathcal{E}(\theta \mid y) & =\frac{y+1}{N+2} \\
\operatorname{mode}(\theta \mid y) & =\frac{y}{N} \\
\operatorname{var}(\theta \mid y) & =\frac{(y+1)(N-y+1)}{(N+2)^{2}(N+3)}
\end{aligned}
$$

## Point Estimate

- Squared error loss

$$
\begin{aligned}
\mathcal{E} L(d \mid \boldsymbol{y}) & =\int_{\Theta}(d-\theta)^{2} h(\theta \mid \boldsymbol{y}) d \theta=\int_{\Theta}\left(d^{2}-2 d \theta+\theta^{2}\right) h(\theta \mid \boldsymbol{y}) d \theta \\
& =d^{2}-2 d \int_{\Theta} \theta h(\theta \mid \boldsymbol{y}) d \theta+\int_{\Theta} \theta^{2} h(\theta \mid \boldsymbol{y}) d \theta
\end{aligned}
$$

- Minimum by differentiation

$$
d=\int_{\Theta} \theta h(\theta \mid \boldsymbol{y}) d \theta=\boldsymbol{\mathcal { E }}(\theta \mid \boldsymbol{y})
$$

## Summary of Posterior Distribution

- Posterior summary in general

$$
\begin{array}{r}
\mathcal{E}(\theta \mid y)=\frac{\alpha_{0}+y}{\alpha_{0}+\beta_{0}+N}, \\
\operatorname{mode}(\theta \mid y)=\frac{\alpha_{0}+y-1}{\alpha_{0}+\beta_{0}+N-2} \\
\operatorname{var}(\theta \mid y)=\frac{\left(\alpha_{0}+y\right) \beta_{0}+N-y}{\left(\alpha_{0}+\beta_{0}+N\right)^{2}\left(\alpha_{0}+\beta_{0}+N+1\right)}
\end{array}
$$

## Natural Conjugate Prior

- If you can express you prior knowledge of $\theta$ by a Beta distribution:

$$
\begin{aligned}
h(\theta) & =\frac{1}{B\left(\alpha_{0}, \beta_{0}\right)} \theta^{\alpha_{0}-1}(1-\theta)^{\beta_{0}-1} \\
& \propto \theta^{\alpha_{0}-1}(1-\theta)^{\beta_{0}-1}
\end{aligned}
$$

- Posterior is also a Beta distribution.

$$
\begin{aligned}
h(\theta \mid y) & \propto \theta^{y}(1-\theta)^{N-y} \times \theta^{\alpha_{0}-1}(1-\theta)^{\beta_{0}-1} \\
& =\theta^{y+\alpha_{0}-1}(1-\theta)^{N-y+\beta_{0}-1} \\
& =\operatorname{pdf} \text { of } \operatorname{Beta}\left(y+\alpha_{0}, N-y+\beta_{0}\right)
\end{aligned}
$$

## Example

- Ten tosses of a coin:

HTHHTHHHHT $=10, y=7$

- Prior: B(2,3)
- Posterior: $\mathrm{B}(9,6)=\mathrm{B}(2+7,3+10-7)$



## Example

- 50 tosses of a coin:
$\mathrm{N}=50, \mathrm{y}=35$
- Prior: B(2,3)
- Posterior: B(37,18)



## Posterior Variance

- Expected to be small

$$
\mathcal{E}(\theta \mid y)=\operatorname{var}(\theta)-\operatorname{var}(\mathcal{E}(\theta \mid y))
$$

- Some exceptions
prior: $\quad \operatorname{Beta}(10,2) \quad \operatorname{Beta}(10,2)$
data: $\quad \mathrm{n}=3, \mathrm{x}=1 \quad \mathrm{n}=10, \mathrm{x}=1$
posterior: Beta(11,4) Beta(11,11)


## Predictive Distribution

- posterior predictive

What do we know about the next observation after observing N obs.

$$
\begin{aligned}
h(\tilde{y} \mid \boldsymbol{y}) & =\int f(\tilde{y} \mid \pi) h(\pi \mid \boldsymbol{y}) d \pi \\
& =\int \pi^{\tilde{y}}(1-\pi)^{1-\tilde{y}} \times \frac{1}{B\left(\alpha_{1}, \beta_{1}\right)} \pi^{\alpha_{1}-1}(1-\pi)^{\beta_{1}-1} \\
& =\frac{1}{B\left(\alpha_{1}, \beta_{1}\right)} \int \pi^{\alpha_{1}+\tilde{y}-1}(1-\pi)^{\beta_{1}-\tilde{y}} \\
& =\frac{B\left(\alpha_{1}+\tilde{y}, \beta_{1}+1-\tilde{y}\right)}{B\left(\alpha_{1}, \beta_{1}\right)} \\
& =\frac{\Gamma\left(\alpha_{1}+\tilde{y}\right) \Gamma\left(\beta_{1}+1-\tilde{y}\right)}{\Gamma\left(\alpha_{1}+\beta_{1}+1\right)} \times \frac{\Gamma\left(\alpha_{1}+\beta_{1}\right)}{\Gamma\left(\alpha_{1}\right) \Gamma\left(\beta_{1}\right)} \\
& =\frac{1}{\alpha_{1}+\beta_{1}} \times \frac{\left(\alpha_{1}+\tilde{y}-1\right)!\left(\beta_{1}-\tilde{y}\right)!}{\left(\alpha_{1}-1\right)!\left(\beta_{1}-1\right)!}
\end{aligned}
$$
