vec of a Partitioned Matrix

Let A and B be the usual matrix of the sizes, (ra x cb), and (rb x cb), resp. Assume that ra = rb.

Horizontally augumented partitioned matrix of size (ra x (ca + cb)).

$$C = (A, B) \tag{1}$$

The vec of C is

$$\operatorname{vec}(C) = \begin{pmatrix} \operatorname{vec}(A) \\ \operatorname{vec}(B) \end{pmatrix}$$
 (2)

Now, assuming ca = cb, consider the vertically augumented partitioned matrix of size $((ra+rb) \times ca)$.

$$D = \begin{pmatrix} A \\ B \end{pmatrix} \tag{3}$$

Note that

$$\operatorname{vec}(\boldsymbol{D}) \neq \begin{pmatrix} \operatorname{vec}(\boldsymbol{A}) \\ \operatorname{vec}(\boldsymbol{B}) \end{pmatrix}$$

The vec of D can be expressed as follows using the commutation matrix. The commutation matrix $K_{ca,ra}$ is defined as the matrix with which the relationship

$$\operatorname{vec}(\mathbf{A}) = K_{ca,ra}\operatorname{vec}(\mathbf{A}') \tag{5}$$

is true.

Using this, we have

$$\operatorname{vec}(\mathbf{D}) = K_{cd,rd}\operatorname{vec}(\mathbf{D}') \tag{6}$$

$$= K_{cd,rd} \operatorname{vec} (\mathbf{A}', \mathbf{B}') \tag{7}$$

$$= K_{cd,rd} \begin{pmatrix} \operatorname{vec}(\mathbf{A}') \\ \operatorname{vec}(\mathbf{B}') \end{pmatrix}$$
 (8)

Now partition the rows of $K_{ca,ra}$ into two blocks as

$$K_{ca,ra} = \begin{bmatrix} K1 \\ K2 \end{bmatrix} \tag{9}$$

Then, we have

$$\operatorname{vec}(\mathbf{D}) = K_{cd,rd}\operatorname{vec}(\mathbf{D}') \tag{10}$$

$$\operatorname{vec}(\boldsymbol{D}) = K_{cd,rd}\operatorname{vec}(\boldsymbol{D}')$$

$$= \begin{bmatrix} K1 \\ K2 \end{bmatrix} \begin{pmatrix} \operatorname{vec}(\boldsymbol{A}') \\ \operatorname{vec}(\boldsymbol{B}') \end{pmatrix}$$
(10)

$$= \begin{pmatrix} K1 \begin{pmatrix} \operatorname{vec}(\mathbf{A}') \\ \operatorname{vec}(\mathbf{B}') \end{pmatrix} \\ K2 \begin{pmatrix} \operatorname{vec}(\mathbf{A}') \\ \operatorname{vec}(\mathbf{B}') \end{pmatrix} \end{pmatrix}$$
(12)

This is what we get as we use vecK[D].

Now partition the columns of $K_{ca,ra}$ into two blocks as

$$K_{ca,ra} = \left[\begin{array}{cc} K3 & K4 \end{array} \right] \tag{13}$$

Then, we have

$$\operatorname{vec}(\boldsymbol{D}) = K_{cd,rd}\operatorname{vec}(\boldsymbol{D}')$$
(14)

$$= \begin{bmatrix} K3 & K4 \end{bmatrix} \begin{pmatrix} \operatorname{vec}(\mathbf{A}') \\ \operatorname{vec}(\mathbf{B}') \end{pmatrix}$$

$$= (K3\operatorname{vec}(\mathbf{A}') + K4\operatorname{vec}(\mathbf{B}'))$$
(15)

$$= (K3\text{vec}(\mathbf{A}') + K4\text{vec}(\mathbf{B}'))$$
(16)

This may be more compact.
